We hope for those of you who are returning this year that you found the level of detail in our new report card helpful as you support your child(ren) at home as they work toward mastery of the content in our Common Core State Standards (CCSS). #### Attendance

Our goal is for 76% or more of our students to be in attendance 96% of the time. Our school-wide attendance rate is 69.3%, which represents a 19.5% drop from last month. An attendance rate of 96% is no more than 7 absences in a year. We are concerned with the dramatic drop in attendance rates. Attendance is such a critical factor in our students' success. Thank you for supporting us in this effort. Fourth grade wins the extra PE class, and all the classes with the best attendance will get an extra 10 minutes of recess. We will also be awarding students for perfect attendance each month with our very own CDA trading cards. Finally, Ms. Romero's class gets a Mad Science class for their attendance rate. Bonus!

#### Reading Nonfiction: Notice & Note Stances, Signposts, and Strategies

Last month we shared signposts for fiction reading developed by Kylene Beers and Robert Probst. As most of our students are engaged in nonfiction units of study, our grades 3-5 teachers use 3 essential questions to support comprehension: 1) What surprised me? 2) What did the author think I already knew? 3) What challenged, changed, or confirmed what I knew? They also use the non-fiction signposts below to help students take notice and wonder as they read. See if you can notice these when you

read non-fiction texts with your child and help your child stop and wonder.			
Signposts			
Quoted Words: When you notice the author quotes a <u>Voice of Authority</u> , a <u>Personal Perspective</u> , or cited <u>Other's Words</u> STOP & ask: Why did the author quote or cite this person?	Contracts and Contradictions: When the author presents a difference between what you know and what is happening in the text <i>or</i> a difference between two or more things in the text STOP & ask: What is the difference and why does it matter?		
Extreme or Absolute Language: When the
