

Principal's Message

Greetings. 2018 had a tremendous start. We launched our annual Great American SpellCheck pledge drive, determined our spelling bee finalists who will compete in our annual spelling bee on February 8th at 3:00 PM (new date and time), and engaged in deep study around our approach to the teaching of mathematics, Cognitively Guided Instruction (CGI). Even though the school days were shortened by our winter break, we kept the momentum strong because we understand that every minute counts.

Parents who attended our Coffee & Tea with the Principal learned about the CA School Dashboard (https://www.caschooldashboard.org) which helps stakeholders understand how their school is meeting state targets for school performance on a variety of measures. In order to maintain our positive growth, our teachers are engaging in rich study around trajectories of understanding through which students move as they solve problems around concepts of subtraction, multi-digit multiplication, and fractions. We are continuing to understand the importance of listening to student thinking and carefully selecting strategies to share that spark discussion that develops conceptual knowledge. Finally, we started studying a new book this month, Disrupting Thinking, which explores how we can help students make connections to text when we ask questions like, "How did this book change you?" or "What did you learn about yourself today?" By helping students uncover how a text affected them, we strive to create a deeper connection to text that will increase comprehension and encourage critical thinking.

At morning assembly last week, we marked the halfway mark of the school year. We are also approaching the 100th day of school this Monday, February 5th, a milestone that our classrooms incorporate into their mathematics instruction. This is the time of year where our Booster Club is also planning fun and memorable fundraisers. as we set goals for the 2018-2019 school year. Each year since 2009, my first year as principal, we have been able to raise more money so that we can afford for our students the kinds of staff and programs we know they need and deserve. As we enter the month of February, our parent body will launch their Hearts Campaign, which asks that we give what we can, in time or money, so that we can continue to enjoy the joy of music, the wonder of visual arts, the supports of our teachers' assistants, and the care of our librarians. Disrupting Thinking

In their book, Kylene Beers and Robert Probst present the kinds of readers we should encourage in our classrooms and beyond. They must first be *responsive readers*, ones who are present in their head and heart and thinking deeply about how a text makes them feel and how others respond to it as well. Secondly, they must be responsible. A *responsible reader* is able to look for signs that may indicate bias or invalidity, asking themselves, "How does it look?", "What does it say?", and "How does it make me feel?" Finally, we need *readers* who are *compassionate*, open to change, possibility, and perspective.
