#### Attendance

Our goal is for 71% or more of our students to be in attendance 96% of the time. Our school-wide attendance rate is 71.3%, which is a drop of 7.5 percentage points from last month, but still above our goal. An attendance rate of 96% is no more than 7 absences in a year. We are pleased that 2/3 of our grade groups are on track to meet that goal, which we hope to improve. Attendance is such a critical factor in our students' success. Thank you for supporting us in this effort. 4th & 5th grade win the extra PE class, and all the classes with the best attendance will get an extra 10 minutes of recess. We will also be awarding students for perfect attendance each month with our very own CDA trading cards. Finally, Ms. Welch's class gets a Mad Science class for their attendance rate. No more than 7 absences. Keep it under 7.
