Attendance

Our goal is for 71% or more of our students to be in attendance 96% of the time. Our school-wide attendance rate is 71.2%, which is a drop of 0.1 percentage points from last month, but still above our goal. An attendance rate of 96% is no more than 7 absences in a year. We are pleased that 1/2 of our grade groups are on track to meet that goal, which we can improve. Attendance is such a critical factor in our students' success. Thank you for supporting us in this effort. 4th grade wins the extra PE class, and all the classes with the best attendance will get an extra 10 minutes of recess. We will also award 3rd grade with an extra PE class for having the most improved attendance. Students with perfect attendance for December will be recognized with our very own CDA trading cards. Finally, Ms. Block's class gets a Mad Science class for their attendance rate. Bonus! No more than 7 absences. Keep it under 7.

Update on Contract Negotiations with UTLA and LAUSD

Thanks to all of our parents who have reached out to me to inquire about UTLA's announcement of a potential strike by its members: teachers, nurses, and counselors, as a result of unsuccessful negotiations for a new contract. We are so appreciative of the dedication and passion our teachers bring to the work, and no team of folk is more deserving of a solid contract than they and their counterparts in health and human services. We are also hopeful that the meeting that is scheduled on Monday, January 7, 2019, between the two parties, UTLA and LAUSD, will result in an agreement that will prevent a job action and a disruption in our students' program. In the event an agreement is not reached by January 10, 2019, and a strike does occur, school will remain open. We have a plan in place to serve all of our students, which will include daily instruction in all of the core subjects. I of course will lead the work with the help of support staff, district personnel, and volunteers. All volunteers must have completed applications on file. Please email me the week of January 7th with any questions. I will use our Coffee and Tea with the Principal on Monday, January 7th, at 08:45 AM to provide more detailed updates and to field questions from our community. These are challenging times, but together as a community we will manage them together, as we always do. Thanks.
