I know the impact of the job action was felt most keenly by our teachers, nurse, school psychologist, and speech pathologist, though, and they could have not felt more supported by our incredible community of parents and staff. It is in challenging times like the one through which we just navigated that the strength and creativity of a community are tested, and ours passed with flying colors.
